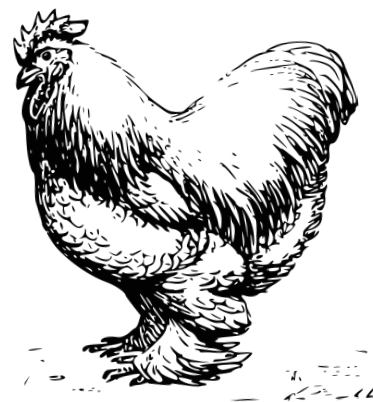

Helpful Information About the Show

Lunch - Please feel free to bring a lunch or eat at one of the many restaurants within close proximity to the Legacy Events Center.

Camping/Trailers - RV and camper hookups are available on site for a fee. If you have further questions, contact Jason.

Cooping In/Out Parking - Turn onto Clark Lane (Like you're going to the jail). Then turn at the sign that says "Davis County Jail Visitor Parking." This paved road will take you back to a parking area right outside our building.

Hotel - The Hyatt Place at Station Park and the Hampton Inn in Farmington are close to the venue. Many others close by.

Junior Showmanship - Please sign up at the table to your right as you enter the building Saturday morning.

Drawing - Prize drawing of poultry and non-poultry related items. Items are donated and proceeds go towards the show. Donations to the prize drawing are greatly appreciated!

Auction - Birds in auction of potential show and breeder quality donated by members and breeders. We greatly appreciate the donation of healthy birds with breeder/ show potential.

Backyard Bird Show

The Backyard Bird Show was created to include hatchery quality birds, non-standard breeds, and mixed breeds. This is a helpful show to enter if you want to share your unique breed with others, are interested in showing but would like guidance on how to get started or even if you are just looking for tips on how you can better prepare your bird for county fairs. A longtime member of the UFPA will judge the backyard show. Awards for the backyard class will consist of Best & Reserve.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

We need as many volunteers as possible for show set up and tear down. Set up starts at 7:00 AM on October 10th. Tear down starts immediately after coop out on August 12th.

REMINDER: 2019 UTAH STATE FAIR

Don't forget! The Utah State Fair is coming up. Coop in is September 6th from 8-10 AM and coop out is September 8th after 8 PM. Like last year, they will be hosting an APA/ABA double show. Entries must be received by **August 23rd**. Anyone can enter! You do not have to participate in a county fair to enter in the State Fair poultry show and out of staters are welcome. Fall 2019 UFPA Show Rules

1. Entry Deadline is September 30th, 2019. Please assure entries are in by this date to allow time to prepare. Entries received after this date will be accepted until October 5th with a \$1 late registration fee per bird..
2. Birds will be accepted in the showroom on Thursday, October 10th from 3PM to 9PM and Friday, October 11th from 7:00AM to 8:30 AM.
3. Judging will start at 9:00AM, Friday, October 11th, 2019.
4. Open show birds will be judged by the latest APA and ABA Standards. Backyard birds will be judged on condition.
5. Make sure you state on your entry form whether entries are LARGE FOWL or BANTAM and whether NON-BEARDED or BEARDED, SINGLE or ROSECOMB.
6. Large Fowl awards will consist of Champion and Reserve Large Fowl, and class champions. Bantam fowl class awards will consist of Champion & Reserve Bantams and class champions. Waterfowl awards will consist of champion and reserve champion. A best and reserve of show will also be chosen. Juniors Awards will be Champion, 1st and 2nd Reserve Large Fowl and Champion and 1st and 2nd Reserve Bantam. Backyard will be Champion and Reserve. At least 5 birds from 2 exhibitors need to be present in a class in order to receive awards.
7. No one will be allowed in the aisles during judging.
8. Cage tags are to be removed ONLY by exhibitors whose birds are in the cage.
9. All birds must have NUMBERED LEG OR WING BANDS. Leg band numbers are not required until coop in. Please write your band number on front and back of coop cards.
10. All birds are entered at the OWNERS RISK. The UFPA, its officers or members will not be responsible for any damage, accident, loss or death of any entry during the show.
11. Any bird showing evidence of disease or sickness will be placed in isolation & returned to owner.
12. No one will be allowed to handle the birds except the judge, show committee or its owners.
13. Advertising or placing signs on the exhibition coops or placing of birds in auction will not be permitted until after the judging is completed.
14. Entry forms have been provided in the newsletter and are also available on our website under "Show Information".
15. Coop out will be after the Coloring Contest judging Saturday. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** After, we will be taking down the showroom. Any help is appreciated. If birds are left after coop out they may be boxed up in extra boxes and left for exhibitor to retrieve.
16. All open show entries must be recognized in the latest ABA-APA Standards. All other non standard entries will be judged but will not place better than best of variety.
17. The UFPA will not accept responsibility for birds shipped from out of state.
18. Exhibitors will be responsible for feeding and watering his/her birds. Scratch furnished by IFA.
19. Only pairs and trios will be accepted in the auction. All birds must be of BREEDER or potential SHOW QUALITY.
20. Birds cannot be removed from show building without permission of Show Superintendent.
21. Once birds are entered into cages they cannot be removed from cage except to hand groom or clean birds or pen.
22. No skirting of cages with any material, except clear plastic to prevent fighting.
23. Carrying cages can be stored underneath show cages as long as aisles are kept clean and clear.
24. Parking lot sales are against venue policy and are not allowed.
25. The UFPA does NOT support any illegal actions or inhumane use of poultry.
26. All exhibitors must follow the Legacy Events Center Rules.

Out Of State Exhibitors

Per the Utah Department of Agriculture's animal importation requirements

(<http://www.ag.utah.gov/animal/animal-import.html#poultry>) any chicken entering a Utah show from out-of-state will need to present either NPIP certification (VS Form 9-3) or a health certificate plus documentation it has tested negative for Pullorum/Typhoid within the last 30 days. This will not be checked by club leadership but may be requested by a state veterinarian if present. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call Dr. David Frame (435.851.2233).

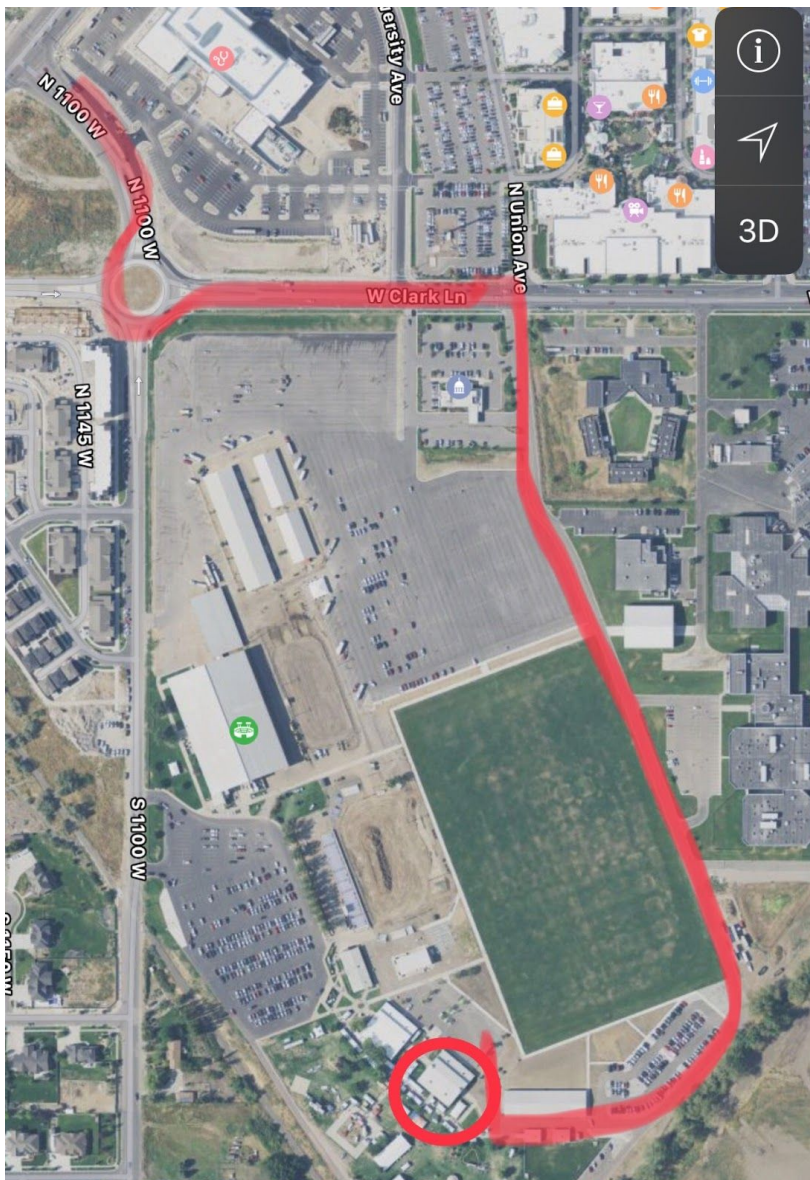

Egg Competition

Anyone is welcome to enter. Exhibitors in the egg competition are not required to enter birds in the show. There is an entry fee of \$4 for the each exhibitor's first entry and \$3 for each additional entry made by the exhibitor. **Fees for this competition will be collected the day of the show but please have exact change.** No prior registration required. This competition will be judged by UFPA member(s).

Rules

- One entry consist of a group of 3 eggs.
- Entries shall note the breed of eggs, non standard (not a breed recognized by APA), mix, or unknown ancestry
- Entries will be judged within classes - white, brown, and other color (speckled or mottled will be entered by background color)

Judging Criteria

- Shell Color: Is the color consistent throughout the entry?
- Shape: Are they too elongated, too small, too rounded?
- Uniformity: How closely do the eggs match each other in size and weight?

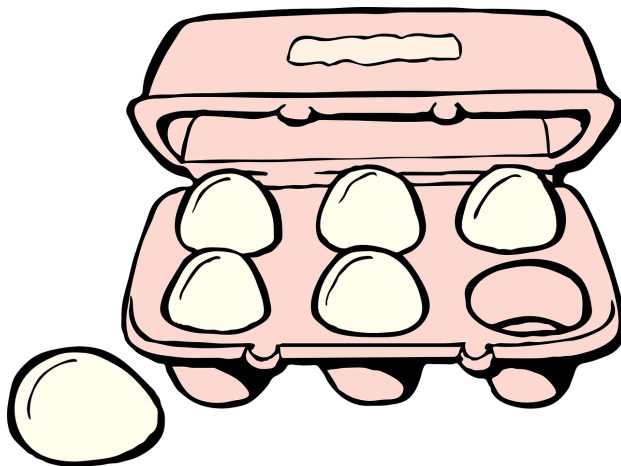
Artistic Egg Classes

Painted Egg Competition

- 1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.
- Open and Junior
- Egg must be hard boiled or blown.
- Egg is painted or inked. NO adornment or decorations added.
- Some type of upright support recommended.
- Egg must be painted/inked by exhibitor.

Decorated Egg Completion

- 1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.
- Open and Junior
- Egg must be hard boiled or blown.
- Egg is to be adorned or decorated, but may have paint added.
- Outline of egg must be recognizable.
- Egg decoration must be created by the exhibitor.

☺ Only Ameraucana Alliance Members are eligible for these awards by the club and our members, except nonmembers are eligible for ribbons & rosettes in Junior Competition only.

☺ Awards with cash values require at least two exhibitors competing with 3 or more birds or egg entries in a class to be awarded.

☺ Eggs entered into the egg judging contest become the property of the Ameraucana Alliance.

☺ Some members prefer cash and some prefer trophies of some sort. Winners have the choice of either cash or non-cash for club sponsored awards. Dollar amounts are associated with each win and each winner may decide whether to receive the cash or a non-cash (hardware) award, such as a plaque, rosette, coaster, etc. of fairly equal value with shipping figured in. This gives the winners the option and by having non-cash awards made after the meet the winner's name may be included in custom designed awards.
